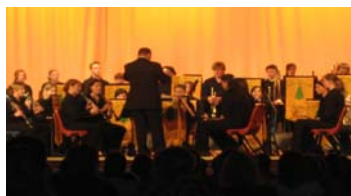

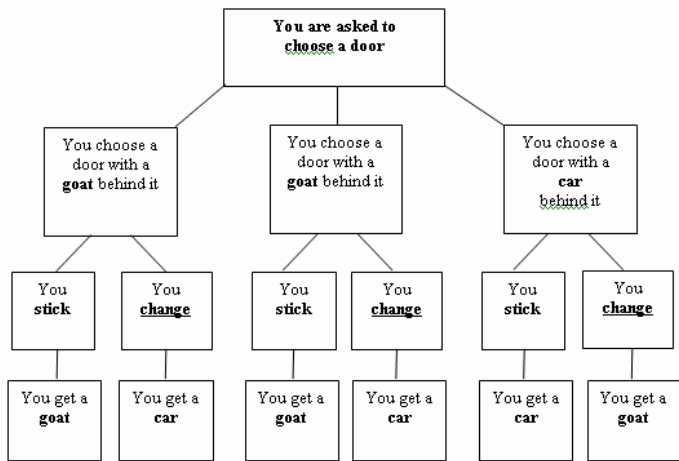
This problem is known as the Monty Hall Problem and the short answer is to pick the other unopened door instead of sticking with your original choice. There are many animations of the explanation on the internet.
