Year 12 Students Complete Annual School Survey

All Year 12 students were surveyed recently by our School Council in order to check levels of student satisfaction with the school's strategic priorities for the period 2007 – 2009. A survey has been administered at this time of the year for the last eight years.

The results have been collated and have been studied by our School Council and School Management Team recently.

The percentage levels of satisfaction are generally very pleasing. There is one notable exception and that is with students 'level of satisfaction with student behaviour.' This cohort of students is

demanding higher standards of behaviour from the younger students and their peers.

As part of the survey process, the Year 12 students were encouraged to identify specific issues or concerns and to provide if possible, suggestions for improvement. These have been studied closely and in the near future, students will be given the opportunity to provide further comment and suggestions in a focus group situation.

Senior (Year 12) References

The Year 12 Reference is the official school reference supplied to students at the end of Year 12. This is only provided if students complete the required application. Every Year 12 student should have received the necessary paperwork from their PREP / Committee teacher.

- Forms must be completed and returned to their Prep / Committee teacher by Monday August 3 (today).



From the Guidance Officer Cyber Bullying

Bullying comes in many forms but one of the most sinister forms is through technology (the internet or mobile phones) in the form of MSM messaging, emails, face book etc. Psychologist Michael Carr-Greig is a founding member of the national centre for bullying. He works for Beyond Blue, and he's also been called upon to help counsel the students in the latest loss of life through cyber bullying. He states that cyber

bullying is worse than school yard bullying as it can continue 24/7. Because the bully doesn't need to see its victim the bullying is often more intense, and more frequent and can be far more damaging. Cyber bullying is difficult to get away from as today's youth are in many ways so deeply dependent on their phones and computers to develop or increase their social network, that banning them would be what the kids would call 'social death'.

Here are some ideas:

- Talk to your child about bullying – ask them if it has or is happening to them either face to face or through the mobile or internet. If it is happening act now.
- Supervise your child's internet and mobile usage (with teenagers this may be more difficult but as children need 8.25 to 9.25 hrs of good sleep each night, encourage the mobile to be turned off and left outside the bedroom.
- Limit internet usage. Where possible have the computer in a public area.
- Watch for changes in your child's behaviour – Are they withdrawn or not themselves? Are they sad/ tearful/angry/ not enjoying things they may have once enjoyed? Is school work affected?
- As bullies thrive on secrecy, if you, the parent know about bullying then report it – to the school or police and ensure follow up with you occurs.

Michael Carr-Greig states that to help children be resilient:

- They need to have an adult in their life whom they feel safe with (and will feel comfortable talking to)
- Children need to learn social and emotional skills – both at home and at school.
- Provide a balanced life for your child – school is one part of their life. Involve them also in the arts, music, sport, leisure.
- Teach your child to self- talk positively – it's just as easy to say something nice about yourself as it is to put yourself down

IT'S NOT OK TO BE AWAY!

Unacceptable attendance rates are not problems that have only arisen over the past few years, they have been around for decades.

In the past though, the reasons for these rates laid primarily with truancy and a high degree of social dysfunctionality.

Today's rates relate far more to households that don't see continuous attendance as an absolute essential to a successful education and thus condone absences for inappropriate reasons such as shopping, child minding etc.

Unfortunately, parents who adopt this approach are setting in motion a process in which their children will miss valuable instruction and are launched into a stressful cycle of trying to "catch up". The reality is that they give up trying to regain these lost lessons and as such have a permanent gap in their knowledge base. This is an absolute fact and severely hinders their capacity to reach their potential in future years.

As mentioned several months ago, when you read your son's/daughter's report at the end of the semester, and it is commented that they have missed this and that, reflect on the absences that have been condoned for reasons other than genuine illness.

Have you received a letter stating that your son/daughter is progressing unsatisfactorily because they have not completed set work? And yes, he/she is jeopardizing his/her promotion to the next year level.

Should you require assistance in saying NO to your son/daughter with regard to unacceptable absence, please contact his/her Year Level Co-ordinator immediately.

Lets all work together to make a difference to your child's future.

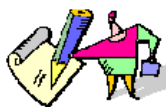
