The Qld State titles were held at QUT - Gardens Point in the Engineering Campuses. This year, there was over 39 teams competing across 4 different categories. Element 79 from Pine Rivers SHS was in the second top level of the competition as Junior Professionals. The team members are all from Y8 and are in their very first year of the competition:

Element 79 - is named from the periodic table of elements - Gold. Using the sign "AU" and the green and gold colors these guys have looked to win "Gold" from the start.

The team decided that they really wanted to have a proper attempt at doing well at the event and spend many early mornings, late afternoons and weekends at school in preparing their cars, pit display, portfolio and other judging elements. They also decided to stay at the YHA in Brisbane in order to spend extra time rehearsing for the judging presentations. They were accompanied with their teachers Miss Gomez and Mr Gieskens. After a big Sunday afternoon and evening completing the teams portfolio and having cars ready for hand in the following morning the team went to bed in their accommodation feeling quietly confident. On Monday after playing around more with their cars to get the best possible engineering points the team walked down to QUT and submitted all of their judging elements and set up their pit display. Monday evening was spent working on preparing for verbal presentations, pit display judging, and engineering judging - it was a late night. On Tuesday, after attempting to fix some regulation breaches on their car looked great on track with some very fast times and by the end of the day were hopeful that they might win an award or two. Certainly they had no idea how well they were doing, and as teachers it was really refreshing to see how humble these amazing Y8's were. Tuesday night, three of the team members returned to school as part of the Instrumental GALA night, and performed. On Wednesday, Youla shined with some of the fastest reaction times across the week of the competition to win outright the Knock Out Races and officially win their first award.

Could they be the next team from the Pine to represent at a world level? Only time will tell, but they certainly dominated at the Qld State finals, not only winning their Junior Professional class, but also winning the event outright, being crowned overall state finals Champions and invited to represent the State at the National Finals.

Our parent community has access to some specific financial life skill resources that will benefit our families, and particularly our teenage children.

These resources include video materials, financial life skill posters for bedroom walls, articles' for parents and links to websites which parents of teenagers may find useful. All resources on the Parents webpage have the purpose of helping parents to guide their teenage children in relation to financial decision-making.

Behaviours and Financial Decision-Making

Financial decision-making occurs as a result of the behaviours and habits we have developed throughout our lives. How much time we research, investigate and analyse information is often a result of the education we have received in relation to financial decision-making. As we grow from childhood, through the teenage years and into adulthood, if we have not had opportunities to engage in "practice" financial decision-making activities then we will have limited capacity to find the best decision when it is for real.

Behavioural studies and ASIC's own research identifies a range of related barriers that prevent people from making good financial decisions. These include information and choice overload, complexity and uncertainty, time effects and pressures, over (and under) confidence, self-control and framing' (i.e. how information is presented)

Understanding these barriers is a good first step in recognising how personal behaviours can influence the choices we make. For example, what is our behaviour when we don't understand a financial service or product presented to us? If we think a product is too complex, or there are too many choices, how do we react? Why do we display that behaviour? How has education or a lack of financial education informed that behaviour?

As a parent, how can you support the financial education of your child? What behaviours or habits related to money management are they currently developing?
