The Department of Education is collecting the personal information in this form in order to:

Where applicable, the information is being collected in accordance with section 102 of the Education and Care Services National Regulations and the Education and Care Services Regulation 2013 (Qld). The information will only be accessed by authorised departmental staff and stored securely. The information will be dealt with in accordance with the confidentiality requirements of, as applicable, section 426 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (Qld), the Information Privacy Act 2009 (Qld), and/or the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). The information will not be disclosed to any other person or agency unless we have your consent or we are required or authorised by law to do so e.g. in compliance with relevant Queensland Chief Health Officer's Directions.

On **28 – 29th February** we will be holding our **Instrumental Music Camp** (the activity) as part of our Instrumental Music program. The focus of the camp is on intensive rehearsals in music ensembles and the building of strong team bonds through recreational activities (low ropes challenge and frisbee golf.

This activity has been determined to be a **medium risk activity**, due to the nature of music rehearsal and performance, use of equipment and participation in onsite activities (low ropes and frisbee golf). The risk management has been addressed through consideration of venues, adequate qualifications of staff and necessary equipment requirements met. Detailed risk assessments are available to view if required. It is anticipated that up to 55 students and 4 staff will be attending giving a student-staff ratio of 14:1. All current COVID Safe guidelines will be complied with during tour.

Refund Policy

Under the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 state schools can charge fees for some services to enhance students' educational experiences. - completing the Request for Refund form available from the school office
- providing a copy of the receipt of payment for the extra-curricular activity if possible.

The decision as to whether the school will or not refund the payment in part or in full depends on whether the school has incurred any costs associated with the activity.

Where possible, we prefer to credit the refundable amount against the student's account at the school, and use it to offset any future charges.

It is very important that you meet all timelines outlined in this letter, as we need to meet deadlines set by the venue.


